MULTI-FAMILY ACCESSIBLITY DESIGN STANDARDS

Fair Housing Act Accessibility Guidelines (FHAAG)

- Projects built prior to March 13, 1991 are exempt
- Regulates multifamily units, common areas, and accessible route.

Americans with Disability Act Accessibility Guide (ADAAG) - Title III

- Regulates publicly accessible areas of a property
- Examples being leasing office, walks and drives

ADA Title II

- Applies to LIHTC Transactions
- Very similar requirements to UFAS

Uniform Federal Accessibility Standards (UFAS)

- Projects subjected to Section 504 requirements / Federal Funds Involvement
- Accessibility standards for resident rooms and commons
- 5% of units are to be fully accessible / 2% of the units A/V
