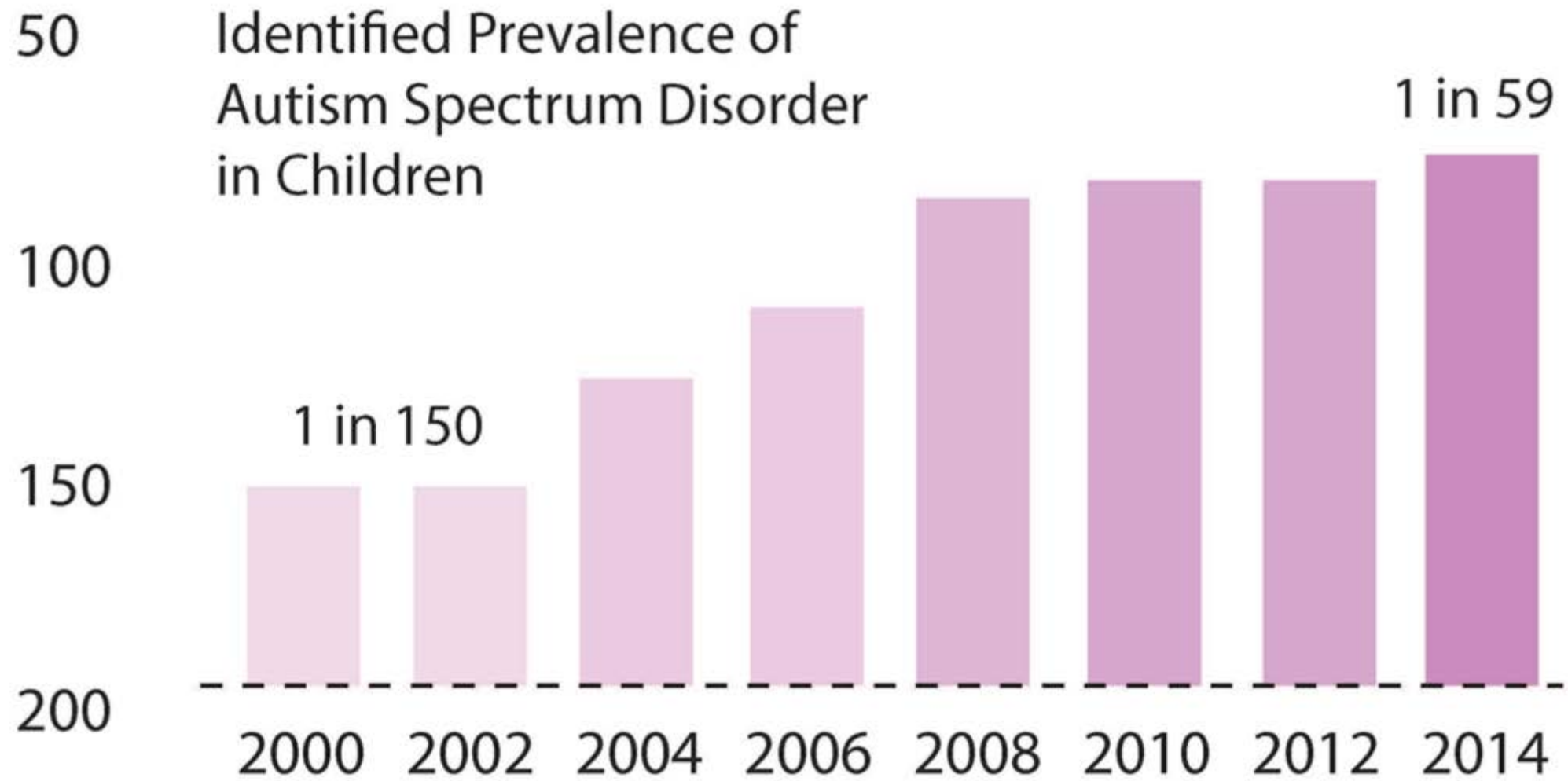
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Autism Living: Board member

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1 in 37 boys

1 in 151 girls

31% have an intellectual disability

44% have average to above average IQ

Minority groups tend to be diagnosed later and less often

Estimated one-third are non-verbal

Estimated one-third are overweight (23% general population)

16% are obese (10% general population)

Waitlists for schools sometimes in excess of 5 years

4.8 million with a disability rely solely on Supplemental Security Income (SSI)

- **Average monthly payment: \$763**
- **Average monthly rent for 1 bedroom apt: \$861**

3 million diagnosed with autism in the US

Up to 3 million undiagnosed

87% of autistic adults live with parents

22% state they want to live there

35% require 24-hour support

The public realm offers relative autonomy and the desired spectrum of independence.



FEEL CLEAR

The public realm makes sense and is not confusing.

The public realm diminishes the risk of being injured.



FEEL CALM

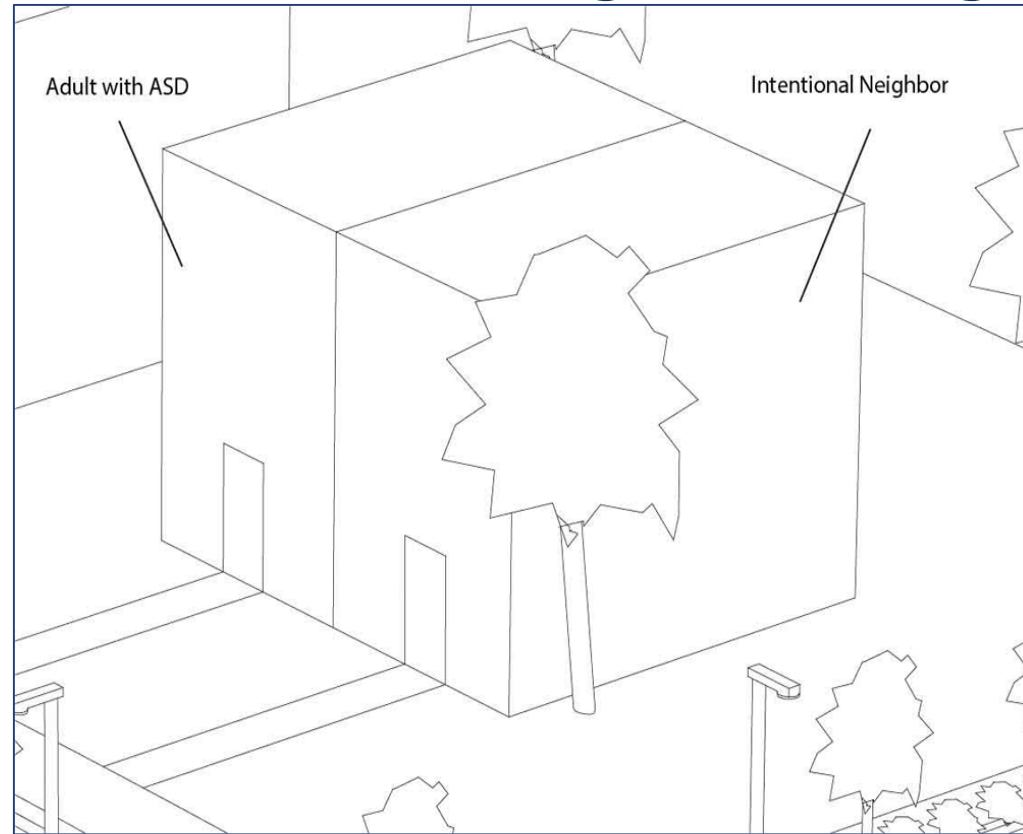

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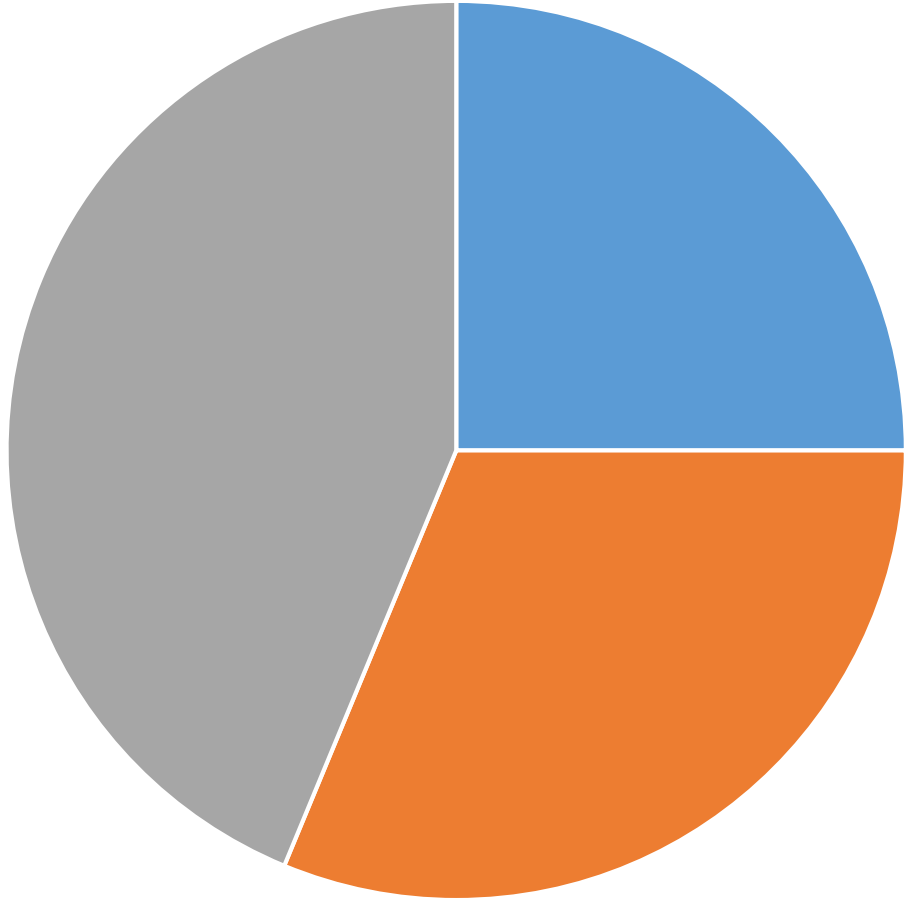
